## From the Director's Desk

Welcome to July. I'm not sure how we got here so fast but it has definitely been a busy last couple of weeks. It has been great seeing all the smiling faces as they arrive for the day so very eager to get their day started. We continue to welcome back our second phase of children to the center. DCCC is now operating at fifty percent of enrollment for the next several weeks.

We are excited to share that in June, we applied for funding through the CARES ACT designated for Child Care Centers. We received the funding for both DCCC and the Summer School Age Program. On July 9th we received another email stating that additional funding is available once again for Child Care Centers. This funding is extremely important to help cover the salaries and wages that we continue to pay regardless of our low enrollments. We know how important child care is to the employees of the college and the community. It definitely is a "Team" effort reopening and establishing new guidelines and procedures.

All preschool families should have received the email in regards to the EITC scholarships available to those families (those entering Yellow Bears and up) that qualify. Please take the time to check out the income levels and feel free to let me know if you have any questions.

Staff continue to implement new cleaning and disinfecting procedures. We are encouraging mask wearing with the children, washing hands, spacing seating apart at snacks, meals and nap and line up times. Mask wearing for the children has been going well and we continue to model as Teachers how to use our masks. It is a process and we are all doing our very best. We continue to have separate play times, use separate outside doors to go to the playgrounds and disinfect playground equipment/toys after each use. We continue to change to outside shoes to lessen the frequency of contamination within our rooms.

During July we will have a number of staff taking time off for appointments, vacations or just time away from the center. This will require DCCC and the Summer School Age Programs to begin to use substitutes within some of our classrooms. The goal is to be as consistent as we can but we also have to be wise in still following all our state regulations with ratios and supervision. Please know that we are constantly reviewing our schedules and staff coverage. All substitutes attended a COVID-19 meeting in June in order to review all new policies and procedures. Our entire staff have been extremely flexible and are working with much diligence to keep your child safe and healthy when attending care. Please do your part and supply a mask daily!

As of July 7th, OCDEL (Office of Child Development and Early Learning) along with DHS has issued a report to provide additional guidance to Child Care Centers. I plan to have additional information that should go out by Monday, July 13th addressing any changes to our current policies or procedures related to COVID-19.

We have set a date in July to meet with the Advisory Committee so that we can continue to plan for the fall in order to be able to continue our new procedures related to COVID- 19.

Thank you all for your support and positive attitudes in returning to care.

### **Blue Bees**

As we arrived back to DCCC in the month of June, many things were very different. The biggest difference was the very low numbers in the Blue Bee room. But that just meant more individual time with teachers. Some other changes we have made is that there are less toys on the shelves so we can be sure that they are all being cleaned between play times. We are wearing masks during free play times when we will be



closer together or playing with a peer so we can be sure to keep our germs to ourselves instead of sharing them with each other. When we are not wearing masks, we are trying to keep distance between ourselves during times such as snacks, lunch, large motor and outdoors. We are also washing hands more often and are working really hard to have a 20 second scrub time to make sure we get our hands squeaky clean for playing, eating snacks and lunch, after we use the potty, when we arrive in the morning and coming in from outside on the playground. We also have two sets of shoes one for inside and one pair for outside that we switch when we arrive to school, before going outside and before going home. Another change is that we do not combine with the yellow bees in the morning, outside on the playground and at the end of the day. All these changes are helping us to stay as safe as possible during this time of Covid 19. We will continue to follow these new procedures until further notice. One change we will do for July is that the families will now be allowed to enter the building and bring their Blue Bee to the Blue Bee door but we ask that only the child enter the room until further notice. Although we had many changes in June, we still managed to have fun learning about Sun and Summer Safety and we had a fun week talking about Outdoor Fun.

In July we will be saying welcome back to some more Blue Bee families and we will also be following most of the safety guidelines that we followed in June with one change that parents will now be able to bring their Blue Bee to the classroom door.

**July Theme: Vacation Let's Go** – We will talk about going to the beach, visiting the zoo, camping fun and transportation.
