

The Popel Shaw Center for Race & Ethnicity (PSC) is a student-centered office focused on supporting the needs of students from historically underrepresented cultural groups (Black/African-American, Asian/Pacific Islander/Asian-American, Biracial/Multiracial, Latino and Indigenous People). The PSC also aims to foster strong cross-cultural awareness and connections through multiple forms of engagement including programs, collaborations, trainings and other opportunities.

PSC STUDENT DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

- MANdatory: The PSC coordinates MANdatory, an academic enrichment and leadership development program for male identified students of color. The group meets on a weekly basis to discuss topics like social identity, campus engagement opportunities, and leadership skills, among others.
- Multicultural Mixer: The PSC hosts a multicultural discussion group for Dickinson community members to connect with each other socially and share their experiences. Each meeting focuses on a theme and includes a delicious menu of food and beverage.
- A.C.E (Academic and Co-Curricular Excellence) Peer Mentor Program: The A.C.E Peer Mentor Program, an engagement, development and support program for select first year students that pairs them with a trained upper-class mentor.
