In the summer of 2010, I travelled to Rwanda as a volunteer with a non-profit organization called Hope Shines. This organization mentors children living in the local Kigali area, while partnering with different camps, one of which is an orphanage. As a volunteer, I worked with four summer camps that provided artistic and athletic activities to help empower and inspire kids to reach their maximum potential. I also taught lessons on the importance of staying in school and trying to make the most out of one's education. Hope Shines even had an event called "college day" where volunteers spoke about their educational journeys and the children shared their own aspirations.
