From the Director's Desk



Well, we made it through another summer! Summer at DCCC is always a busy time but it is also full of lots of energy. Making new friends and welcoming new summer teachers is exciting. We are always so happy to hear that the children transitioned well to their schools and wish our summer teachers the very best as they return to college or venture out to find a permanent teaching job. Welcome to the new school year here at DCCC!

The current enrollment for the Children's Center is 112 children. We have 91 families. This year we reached our maximum in Kindergarten enrollment which is 15 children. We hope to post our new and updated waiting list on our website within the next few weeks.

The center had a very successful Summer School Age Program that was held in the big room and consisted of field trips, crafts, outside play and many educational games and special visits. The total children for the summer school age program averaged 30 children a day for 10 weeks of care.

We welcomed 32 new children at the start of the school year on the 18th of August. All the children have seemed to adjust very well overall to their new rooms and in some cases to their very first experience in group care.

The center was closed on August 15th and the teachers attended a training titled: <u>Head Bumps Matter</u>, <u>Playing Safely</u>. The training shared many safety suggestions for playgrounds and child care space. It also reviewed the signs of a concussion in young children.

We welcomed one new student worker who will be working in the afternoons. A few new substitutes were also hired to help out when teachers need to take off. More details will be shared as they start this fall.

The center has begun to focus on our \$15,000 goal for fundraising. Fundraising information was distributed to all families and the big fall fundraiser is in the works.

The center has an Advisory meeting Scheduled for September 30th at 4:15.

Ducklings



We are a little over two weeks into the new year and we are pleased to welcome five new infants into the Duckling classroom! At this time we have six infants ranging in age from about 8 weeks to 10 months. Some are working on tummy time; some just beginning to roll over; some to creep and crawl and some beginning to pull themselves up! We all have our own individual preferences for feedings, sleeping and playing, so we have a very flexible schedule in the infant room right now. However, we have managed to take advantage of the beautiful last days of summer, getting outdoors and resting on a mat in the shade on our playground. The infants seem to love this very calming activity, sleeping outdoors, or watching the clouds shift overhead and listening to the wind chimes sing or to the happy preschoolers playing next door.

During the month of September we will continue to work on getting to know each other gradually. It takes time and patience to begin to understand each other and to build those trusting relationships! We will listen to stories and songs; look at board book pictures; explore sensory books; take nature walks to detect the early signs of autumn; listen to nursery songs and lullabies; manipulate keys, rattles & chew toys. Some of us will be working on the introduction of sippy cups, solid foods and table foods, holding a spoon and sitting up in a high chair. And there will be lots of floor play and exploration!

You will receive a newsletter and lesson plan by email each month during the course of this year. You will also find a hard paper copy of the Infant lesson plan in your bin and one posted on the hallway bulletin board. Lesson plans are developmentally based and for infants, activities revolve largely around basic care activities. Because there is a wide age range in the infant room, you may see activities on the plan that are not developmentally appropriate for your child. The plan is designed to cover the individual needs and goals of each child.


Once again, please remember to label all of your babies' belongings, especially bottles. We find that the names are already washing or wearing off some of the feeding bottles, so please play close attention to re-marking them as necessary.

Please also send in family photos of everyone and anyone important in your baby's life. This includes parents, grandparents, siblings, cousins, aunts, uncles, pets, friends, etc. Babies love to look at photos of their families. These family photos will be hung in the classroom. As the babies get older, they begin to recognize and point to family members in photos. Such images from home can help to ease the transition from home to daycare.

We would like to thank you for your patience and understanding as the Nursing Lounge is being prepared. The creation of a separate, quiet space for parents to be with their babies at feeding time is something we have been very excited about. It remains a work in progress! Improvements to the space are ongoing and we hope that in a short time you will find it to be a comfortable and welcoming space for you and your baby to spend time together.

Our caterpillar friend emerged into a big beautiful butterfly during our very first week and we think that this is a good omen for the rest of our year together! We welcome you all to the Duckling Room and look forward to a wonderful year.

We washed hands, walked in the hallway, did a fire drill and sat quietly for circle. The kids really do know the rules! Our second week we talked all about ourselves. We spent circle time making child models for each of the Blue Bears. They are hanging around the room; try to guess which one belongs to your child!

We look forward to September when we will talk about our families. We will draw pictures of



them and our houses and put on puppet shows to show everyone how many people are in our families. We will also make frames to go around the family photos that everyone will be asked to bring in. We hang these inside the house so when your child misses you they can snuggle up and look at their family photos. Next up will be friends! We will try drawing with our hands tied together, playing friend Bingo, draw on our friends faces (on paper of course!) and make a lot of friendly art work for the hall. We will also talk about how we should treat our

friends. This is a great week to introduce our PATHS friends, so look for paper work about that. Following family week is the popular germ week. We think Ms. Mandy's cousin Valerie Virus might pay us a visit to talk about coughing and sneezing in our elbows. We will finish out September with a week on shapes, making fun art projects and going on walks around campus looking for shapes on signs and buildings.



We will begin our letter of the week as well. Our letter song we sing everyday helps us to remembers the letter's sound. We read our letter book, read a poem, play a letter game and even practice writing letters. Make sure to take a look at the word wall, where the kids make a list of words that begin with that week's letter sound.

We will be posting sign-ups and special event flyers above the cubbies on the bulletin boards. Please keep your eyes peeled for those announcements. We also have a wish list for Scholastic Book Orders hanging on our door every month if you are interested in donating a book for the class. We always appreciate it! Bunnies

The first two weeks with the new class have flown by! Everyone is doing a great job of getting the routine down. The children have enjoyed being with their old friends and meeting some new ones as well. We have spent the first week learning about the room and the rules and routine. Then the second week we really started to get to know each other. We can already tell this is going to be a great year!

The first week of September we will be talking about colors, making patterns, and mixing colors. Following that we will have a week on friendship where we will focus on bucket filling and be making our individual buckets. We will then move into a week about apples, where we will taste test different kinds of apples, bake and do some experiments. Look for some sign-up sheets during this tasty week. Following that we will have a week on shapes. We will learn the names of the shapes, build with shapes and talk about some 3D shapes as well. That brings us to the end of September with a week on fire safety. We will learn what to do in case of a fire, what firefighters wear and what number to call if we need help.

Reminders:

- -Please make sure that you are filling your child's extra clothes bin.
- -In the morning please have your child wash their hands when they enter the classroom.
- Lunch heat ups go in the black crate in the refrigerator so we can make sure each child gets their lunch quickly to ensure they have the full time to eat.
- Please send in forks/spoons in your child's lunch. Also if your child has pasta it is helpful to cut the noodles into smaller pieces to make it easier to eat with their utensils.
- Remember we are a peanut and tree nut free facility, make sure you are reading labels carefully.

<u>Kindergarten Dolphins</u>

After a fun and busy "practice" week in the kindergarten room, the Dolphins are now full-fledged kindergartners! The children all seem to be happy and eager to learn and Miss Cheri and I are looking forward to getting to know each child better.

During the first few weeks our class we will be establishing class rules, practicing routines, establishing a sense of class community, and sharing our hopes and dreams for our kindergarten year. We'll talk about what it means to be a good friend, and will practice resolving peer conflicts. During the first weeks of school, we'll also study about our world through our senses as we learn about living things. We'll explore our garden and learn about parts of plants and what plants need to survive. We'll compare, collect, and taste vegetables from the garden and will hunt for little garden invertebrates who happen to be crawling, hopping, and flying among them. The children are en-

couraged to bring in garden invertebrates that they find in their own gardens at home as well for closer investigation. We plan to create a cricket habitat in our classroom, watch the metamorphous of caterpillars into butterflies, and continue daily observations of our hermit crabs pets!

August 28 is DCCC's 25th birthday, so the Kindergartners celebrated by creating special birthday hats and playing a few party games.

We will begin our "Fill Your Bucket" character building program in September. The children will earn pompoms to put in their own individual buckets in our classroom for showing kindness and respect to others through words and deeds. When a bucket is "filled" the child will be recognized by the class and will receive a "bucket filler" certificate to take home.
