

From the Director's Desk

We are so excited to be into the swing of fall once again. It's so exciting to see the leaves start to change colors and the squirrels scampering around on the playgrounds. The children have all settled into their new rooms and look as if they have been there all year. They no longer look way too little to be in their new rooms. It always makes me think how fast time can go if we don't take the time to enjoy these little milestones with the children. After all, it is a very big deal to be a Yellow Bear these days!

Our Enrollment is currently at 112 children, including 92 families. We still have a few toddler openings and one PT preschool opening. The waiting list has been placed back on line for the remainder of this year.

DCCC welcomed two new substitutes and three new student workers this month. Teachers were busy attending the Infant Toddler Mini conference on the 6th and a number of teachers were trained on Seizure safety on the 16th.

The Shippensburg Education Students will be joining us for one day a week for 10 weeks. Three of the students will be in Bunnies and one student will be in Blue Bears.

The DCCC taskforce was recently formed to look at ways to eliminate the deficit at the Children's Center. The group of faculty, staff and administrators will meet over the next few months and will be reporting back to P&B by the beginning of the New Year.

DCCC has once again received E.I.T.C (Educational Improvement Tax Credit) Scholarship packets for preschool families who meet specific income requirements. The Scholarships were made available thru the Bravo Foundation and Success by 6 – United Way of Carlisle and Cumberland County.

Plans have started for the additional Summer School Age Program to be held at the old Sylvan Building. We will be submitting an application by the end of November and plan to offer an Open House in January.


Reminders:

Kindergarten Dolphins

September certainly was a busy and productive month! We're learning to print letters properly, make letter-sound associations, recognize rhyming words, read some sight words, and understand basic concepts of print. In math so far, we've done activities with shapes, patterns, symmetry, classifying, graphing, counting, numbers, measurement, and money! We do attendance, weather, calendar, and number of the day routines every day in addition to a math lesson and math centers.

In Science this past month we learned the difference between living and non-living things and spent quite a bit of time exploring living things through our senses. Thanks to our kindergarten families, we had a nice variety of invertebrates to observe, and we've been fortunate to observe the metamorphosis of some of a few caterpillars into Black Swallowtail and Monarch butterflies.

At the beginning of October we will be talking about Healthy Habits... germ prevention, eating nutritious foods, and the importance of rest and exercise. For the remainder of the month we'll focus on safety, occupations, and our neighborhood community. Visits from the fire/ ambulance departments are planned for October 6 and 9. We'll talk about various other community helpers and occupations and would love to have parents come into our classroom to share about their own careers! Please let Miss Katie know if you're interested! On October 17 in the Kindergarten Room, we'll have a Career Day, where the children will dress to represent a career they would like to have when they grow up. During our community unit, we'll also learn a little about money and resources and will learn the difference between needs and wants. We'll plan a centerwide Diaper Drive for Project S.H.A.R. E. and will be given a tour of their facility when we deliver them. Please keep in mind that we also have a Project S.H.A.R.E. Penny Pail outside the Kindergarten Room for monetary donations which will be delivered to Project S.H.A.R.E. in April.

Also in October, we'll begin our Color Days, with a goal of learning to read all of the color words by the end of the month. On each featured color day, students should wear as many items as they can with the designated color, and we'll graph the number they're wearing each day.

On October 31, we'll celebrate Halloween with our Halloween/ Fall Harvest Party. We ask that children dress in costumes without masks or accessories. Parents will be invited to our parade around the DCCC parking lot, and we will enjoy party games in the Big Room that afternoon.
