From the Director's Desk

It's hard to believe we are heading into the month of November. Although I love the holidays, usually the bad weather and the Flu are not far behind. As always, we have a lot going on here at the center. Please take the time to read the newsletter and let me know if you have any questions or concerns that I can help you out with.

The Advisory Committee has welcomed a new college member, Christine Baksi. All members will meet in November. The Advisory members meet bi-monthly and take part in providing input for the center policies and procedures.

The Shippensburg students have been busy preparing a night of fun for the preschool classrooms. The event will be held for parents and children sometime in November. More information to follow.

The center has begun the 45 day evaluations and the fall conferences with parents. The state online reporting for the fall date was completed and results will be obtained within a few week

DCCC participated in a Diaper Drive. The Diaper Drive was sponsored by our Kindergarten Class and will benefit the families served by Project Share and the Salvation Army. Staff also continue to donate their time for the Infant Room at Project Share during the monthly Saturday distributions.

Plans are underway to permanently install a Shade Structure on the Infant/Toddler Playground. The installation of the frame is scheduled to take place this fall but the actual shade structure will not be used until spring.

The DCCC Task Force is set to meet during the month of November. The members include individuals from campus wide. The Task Force will address financial concerns of the college and will look at ways to increase revenue for the center.

Staff have been working hard at setting individual goals and will be taking part in their annual self- assessments. Many staff have been taking online trainings and will continue to attend evening courses when available.

The Infant Room will be participating in a free service offered, Technical Assistance from the Stars Program. The TA will help Teachers in working with the layout of the room and the flow of the schedule to increase supervision at all times. The program will also aid in increasing our scores within the ITERS scale.

We also met with our Child Care Health Educator at the end of the month. We reviewed center Health Policies and talked about ways to meet the special needs of our children. Our main goal was to discuss and set up Pediatric First Aid for our staff. New guidelines have decreased the class size, making it difficult to schedule.



Reminders:


