From the Director's Desk

I'm ready for the winter. Seems like the weather has really been going back and forth so much this fall. It's a lot easier as a parent to stay on top of dressing our kids appropriately when the temperature is consistent.

November was full of activities here at the center. Miss Michelle kept the kids moving in the mornings for Promotion Motion. We had a great turn out for the Mini Turkey Trot. The teachers and the kids did a fantastic job. The smiles on the children's faces when they saw all their families were priceless. That's really what makes this fundraiser the best, it's all for the kids!

During the November staff meeting teachers took time to work in their rooms to check for items necessary for ITERS/ECERS. Early this fall, DCCC renewed as a STAR 3 site. A STARS ERS (Environmental Rating Scale) Assessment visit is scheduled to occur within the next few weeks. A number of Health and Safety improvements have been implemented along with the help from the facilities department. Gates were installed to increase supervision and hooks to separate individual child belongings. Steps were made for changing tables while each table also had the height on the sides of the table increased to prevent any accidents from occurring. Meeting the ERS criteria and maintaining the high scores in all the classrooms is a very difficult but extremely important task. It is our hope that our scores will indeed come in high so that we can automatically move to a STAR 4 site.

The Thanksgiving Meal was fantastic. Thanks to Dining Services for a wonderful meal, the children enjoyed the food and eating lunch together with other classes!

The Pancake breakfast is quickly approaching. We need lots of help to make the event successful. Please plan to attend the parent meeting on December 2nd at 4:15 here at the center.

Summer Camp Update: Dickinson College Summer School Age Program: A new Summer Program (operated through DCCC) is in the process of being licensed. It will be located at 1250 Ritner Highway. The 2015 camp is for children ages 9 to 12 years old, and we will continue to offer our Summer Camp Program at DCCC for the younger school-age children. The 10 week camp will consist of full time and part time openings and will run from June 8th to August 21st with a four week minimum. Dear Families,

As we are nearing the winter season, I want to make you aware of the following guidelines that pertain to weather related closings, delays and early dismissals.

Closing/delay due to bad weather:

DCCC will be closed when the college is closed due to bad weather (snow/ice). We will continue to notify families via the e-mail distribution list and through the following media outlets:

<u>TV Stations</u>: WGAL Channel 8 (NBC), WHTM Channel 27 (ABC), WPMT FOX 43, WHP Channel 21 (CBS), and WLYH Channel 15 (UPN)

<u>Radio Stations</u>: WHP 580 AM, WRVV 97.3 FM The River, WRBT 94.9 FM BOB, WHKF 99.3 FM KISS, WITF FM 89.5 NPR, WINK 104 FM, WROZ 101.3 FM The Rose, and WI00 1000 AM (Carlisle Station).

In order to provide the utmost safety to the children within the Center, DCCC also reserves the right to decide to close even if the college would remain open.

If the College decides to delay, DCCC too will delay.

On a one hour delay DCCC will open at 8:30 On a two hour delay DCCC will open at 9:30.

Once again, if possible we will notify families via the e-mail distribution list and local TV stations.

Early Dismissal:

When the college decides to close early due to worsening weather conditions, DCCC will close as well. However, we will add an hour to our closing time in relation to the college time to allow parents within the community enough time to make arrangements to pick up their child safely. (For example, if the college decides to close at 3:00 p.m., the Center will close at 4:00.)

This message will go out via e-mail distribution list, local TV stations and, when necessary the classroom teachers will call their individual families.

Please keep in mind that the college does not decide to close very frequently. However, when they do, it is necessary that we now follow their same schedule in order to provide the utmost safety to the DCCC staff as well. We will be certain to make sure that the Children's Center is specifically stated in order to avoid confusion.
