December was such a fun and festive time, as we experienced all the sights, sounds and beautiful aromas of the holiday seasons....so many firsts in the lives of our young infants! Thank you, parents, for your generous gifts and holiday wishes. In December we also welcomed two new infants into our classroom.

On January 5th we welcomed everyone back from holiday break, which in the lives of our young infants, is a long absence from the Center. There are sometimes some minor readjustments as we all resume our daily routines. We will gently ease back into our routines and find fun opportunities to practice the skills we have learned and to make new, challenging discoveries. We said farewell to two of our young toddler friends, but we look forward to reuniting with them daily on the playground. And we welcomed two infants and a new young toddler into our classroom. January will be a time of becoming acquainted and reacquainted with each other!

Lesson plans in the infant room revolve around essential daily care routines and the developmental needs of each individual child. With that in mind, we will add some new board books, songs and finger play games. Old seasonal favorites, such as "Frosty the Snowman," give us an opportunity to practice our "bye-bye" waves and to label our heads, noses and eyes. Winter themed stories, such as <u>Snowy Animals</u>, <u>Ten Shiny Snowflakes</u> and <u>I Love Winter</u>, allow us to expand vocabulary, to manipulate book pages, to point & label and to make connections to what is happening outside in our own environment (we will take lots of outdoor walks when temperatures permit). We will continue to gradually work toward introduction of new foods and offer opportunities for grasping spoons and self feedings for our older infants. And we will continue to support motor development with lots of free floor space to move, roll, sit, crawl, pull up, cruise and walk.


*Please continue to label ALL bottles and personal clothing items.

<u>Reminders:</u>



Some things to keep in mind are; extra pants, underwear, socks and long sleeve shirts.

Areas we continue to work on:

Proper hand washing, putting on coat, gloves and shoes/boots. Potty training is going great in the Blue Bee room. Almost all of our bees are out of diapers/ pull-ups! Please let us know if we can help you and your child in this area. We are glad to be of service!

Yellow Bear Cubs


We kicked off December with a great week of Trains; we especially loved the Box
