- Contact us if you have filed an **amended** 2019 federal income tax return, were granted an extension and have not filed your 2019 return, or if you were the victim of identity theft.
- Use of the IRS Data Retrieval Tool (DRT) by filing a correction to the FAFSA is strongly encouraged.
