The Waiting List is currently being reviewed. Tours are being scheduled to prospective parents and enrollments for the fall have begun. If anyone is interested in being placed on the wait list, they are encouraged to call the center office.

Grandparent Visiting Day was a hit and we had over 88 visitors at the center. I would like to grant many thanks to all those that participated in the special day. Everyone truly enjoyed their time here. Although it is very busy, we know as teachers, how important it is to welcome all family members and friends into the lives of our children.

A number of staff reviews have been given. All staff will continue to work toward their training goals as well as establishing and reviewing classroom goals. Our Preschool teachers will also be visiting some of the local Kindergarten Programs this month, in order to help bridge the gap between Preschool and Kindergarten. Transitioning the children appropriately is very important to DCCC.

Parent Conferences will begin toward the end of the month. This is a great time for parents to talk one on one with their child's teacher. Substitutes are brought in to cover the shifts so that teachers can be freed up to meet with parents. March was such a busy month, full of new discoveries and emerging skills for us. A big highlight of the month for us was Grandparents' Day. Thank you to those grandparents and other family members and loved ones who came into our classroom on that special day. As we meet your family, we get to know you all a little bit better and that strengthens our relationship and our bond with your baby and family. Thank you! We loved meeting all of you.

The month of April ushers in spring. No more snow!! Please take home your baby's snowsuit now and replace it with more appropriate outdoor wear for nature walks and outdoor play. Bear in mind it may still be windy and chilly, so layering is usually best. Even though we don't worry too much about footwear indoors, we do need foot protection for outdoor play. Robeez, or a similar soft sole protective shoe is fine. If your child is standing and walking, he may need a more supportive style shoe.

Introduction of solid foods, table foods and self-feeding are big happenings in the infant room right now! Feeding is not only a source of vital nutrition for your baby, but it is also a social and emotional experience. Feeding times are happy times in the infant room! Please do not worry about messiness... messiness happens when children are permitted the independence they crave to feed themselves! We don't mind and we have lots of bibs! As you begin to send in table foods for your infant, please make sure all foods are cut into small, infant-size pieces. Review the choking hazard list (posted in the classroom) and we encourage you to avoid highly processed foods. As your younger infant approaches the 9 month mark in the coming weeks and months, we will be sending home the Nine Month Letter, which highlights the developmental goals and expectations for the older infant. Let us know if you have questions or concerns. Please remember that these are all normal expectations for the older infant, but that each child progresses toward them at their own pace.

The "big idea" of our April lesson plan revolves around our animal friends, from the animals we observe in our own neighborhood and campus environment, to farm animals, jungle animals, domestic animals and even extinct animals! Our stories and songs will revolve around this fun theme. Please send in pictures of your family pets to share!



Kindergarten Dolphins



Dinosaurs infiltrated much of our learning during the first half of March. We created a dinosaur land for them in our water table, measured their would-be lengths, examined fossils, found little words and word parts within long dinosaur names, and created a "Dinosaur Math" book using dinosaur stories to represent number equations.

Although he left quite a mess in our classroom, the kindergartners really enjoyed our visit from Lep the Leprechaun. Instead of traps, we created a play yard and wrote letters to him. How thrilling it was to receive letters back from him with many of our questions answered! "Lep" also left lots of little clues throughout the room about his size, weight, and age, all of which we needed to use our skills in math to solve. He did try to trick us by leaving some "fake" gold, but the kindergartners were way too clever to be tricked!

We are welcoming in Spring with a unit about cycles and growth, and are all creating our own "My Life" books using photos of ourselves from birth through kindergarten. We're also learning about what plants need to survive and are planting various seeds in baggies for a "sprouting race". We'll be taking a trip to the DC Greenhouse in April to help Ann plant seeds for our Children's Center garden.

Throughout the month of April, the kindergartners will be learning about our environment and what we can do to conserve resources and protect our environment for ourselves and for other living things. We'll have a trash-free picnic to celebrate Earth Day on April 22 and we'll culminate our unit with a "Rainforest Day" on April 24.

The children will each be preparing an endangered animal project to present to their classmates during the weeks of April 13 and April 20. They'll research information about their chosen animal at home, and in addition to presenting their projects, they'll teach the class about their animal, its diet, habitat, and why it's endangered. At school, the children will also be creating their own "Save the Animal" t-shirts featuring their endangered animals.

April is also the month for the Week of the Young Child. During the week of April 13, there will be a special center-wide theme for each day which we'll incorporate in addition to our unit on the environment. We're looking for a few people who would like to come in to do a short musical presentation for our DCCC children on "Musical Monday", so if you play an instrument, sing, or dance, and you'd be willing to participate, please let me know! Our audience is always quite appreciative and easy to please! On Tuesday, we'll enjoy a "Taco Lunch" and on Wednesday it will be "Building and Construction Day". Please help us to collect some good reusable items (boxes, paper rolls....) as well as some wood scraps to use in our construction that day. Thursday will be "Art Day". There are so many ideas for this, but we'll fine tune our plans closer to that day. On Friday it's "Celebrate our Family Day". We'll be inviting parents (or grandparents) to sign up to come in for any portion of our day. You may choose to read a story to the class, have lunch or snack with your child, share a special talent, or just help out with our normal kindergarten activities.
