From the Director's Desk

Welcome to all of our families. We can't believe that September has come and gone so quickly this year. I think we can all agree we were waiting for cooler weather. It's been great being able to go outside every day, it is such a change from the hot weather this summer.

Our Enrollment is currently at 113 children, including 90 families. We still have a few part time toddler openings and a few preschool openings as well. The waiting list has been placed back on line for the remainder of this year.

DCCC welcomed three new substitutes and four new student workers this month. We also are excited that the Shippensburg Education Students will be joining us for one day a week for a total of 10 weeks this semester. Three of the students will be in Bunnies and one student will be in Blue Bears and one will be in Yellow Bears.

We are pleased to share that our Summer Camp Programs were very successful this past summer. The opening of our additional Summer Camp School Age Program, provided the additional revenue that we were looking for to help support our budget.

DCCC has once again received E.I.T.C (Educational Improvement Tax Credit) Scholarship funds. The Scholarships were made available through the Bravo Foundation and Success by 6 – United Way of Carlisle and Cumberland County. We are delighted that a few of our families qualified for the assistance and were able to take advantage of this wonderful program.

Congratulations to Sandy Bennett in receiving the CAAEYC Innovation Grant. Ms. Bennett Inside this issue: applied for the grant by writing about our new Nursing and Nutrition Lounge. The center received \$700.00 to put towards the cost of the new room.

There will be lots of improvements made to our playgrounds this fall. There will be some work being done to improve the drainage and the erosion of the soil around the fencing on the Toddler and Preschool Playgrounds this fall. We are also excited to share that the Preschool Playground will be having a new surface installed either this fall or in the spring due to the timing of the prior work mentioned. Please keep an eye out for the new picnic tables and the new sand box coming our way this fall. This is great news for the children!



I cannot believe that September is over now! We have learned so much already. We started off September learning about colors. We learned about primary colors, how to make secondary colors, tints, and shades. Then we talked about friendship and learned how to be kind to our friends by being a super friend. October also holds many fun themes and activities. We will start out the month by discussing community helpers. Who are they? What do they do? We will have a visit from a fire truck and an ambulance. Next we will explore leaves and what happens in the fall to the trees, leaves and animals. We will also talk about pumpkins. We will explore what they look like, feel like, how they grow and will carve a few and cook the seeds for a yummy fall treat. Finally we will wrap up the month with learning about bats and spiders.

The letters we will be working on are G, H, I, and J. We will learn their sounds and practice writing them.

KINDERGARTEN DOLPHINS

September certainly was a busy and productive month! We're learning to print letters propermake letter-sound associations, recognize rhyming words, read some sight words, and understand basic concepts of print. In math so far, we've done activities with shapes, patterns, symmetry, classifying, graphing, counting, numbers, measurement, and money! In addition to our daily math lesson and math centers, we consider some of our everyday routines of attendance, weather, calendar, and number of the day to be part of our math curriculum.

In Science this past month we learned the difference between living and non-living things and spent quite a bit of time exploring living things through our senses. Thanks to our kindergarten families, we had a nice variety of invertebrates to observe. So far we've had one caterpillar complete her metamorphosis into a Monarch butterfly, and the kids were in awe as she took flight over the building to start her long journey to Mexico! We hope to release another Monarch very soon, and will have three Black Swallowtails that may decide to wait until Spring to emerge.

At the beginning of October we will be talking about Healthy Habits... germ prevention, eating nutritious foods, and the importance of rest and exercise. For the remainder of the month we'll focus on safety, occupations, and our neighborhood community. On October 23 in the Kindergarten Room, we'll have a Career Day, where the children will dress to represent a career they would like to have when they grow up. During our community unit, we'll also learn a little about money and resources and will learn the difference between needs and wants. We hope to plan a center-wide Food Drive for Project S.H.A.R. E. and will be given a tour of their facility when we deliver the food. Please keep in mind that we also have a Project S.H.A.R.E. Penny Pail outside the Kindergarten Room for monetary donations which will be delivered to Project S.H.A.R.E. in April or May. In addition to our scheduled themes for the month of October, we'll continue to promote "bucket filling" behaviors, and will take some time to work on conflict resolution skills and other pro-social skills.

Our Color Days began at the end of September, and will continue throughout October, with a goal of learning to read all of the color words by the end of the month. On each featured color day, students should wear as many items as they can with the designated color, and we'll graph the number they're wearing each day.

On October 30, we'll celebrate Halloween with our Halloween/ Fall Harvest Party. We ask that children dress in costumes without masks or accessories. Parents will be invited to our parade around the DCCC parking lot, and we will enjoy party games in the Big Room that afternoon.
