Enrollment

DCCC Kindergarten applications have been distributed for the next school year 2016-2017. Summer Camp applications have also been sent out. The ten week camp for both Dragons I and Dragons II will run Monday thru Friday and an additional six fulltime and three part time summer employees will be hired and oriented in order to help the center run smoothly. The camp will take part in educational field trips, special visits, crafts, swimming and daily outdoor games. The Waiting List is currently being updated and the fall classes are being projected. Once again the waiting list will not be available on line as the enrollment process begins during the month of March.

Center Happenings

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You may have been wondering what we purchased with the mini-grant money we were awarded as a part of the PA Nutrition and Physical Activity Self-Assessment for Childcare. Well, because the grant not only focused on health/nutrition, but the amount of physical activity our kids are offered, we looked into what types of new equipment could be used for our Big Room or playgrounds!

I asked a few teachers from older toddlers, preschool and kindergarten if they had anything specific they wished we had, and of course there's always that "wish list"

in the back of our minds! We were able to get a few bowling sets, a hopscotch carpet, and some "trail balls" for our 3's and up. We also purchased two new wagons to haul equipment around the playground, as well as two soccer goals, more soccer balls and cones for older toddlers and preschool/kindergarten to set up outside.

We also have new dancing scarves, and some new "conversation balls" that older toddlers, preschoolers, and kindergarten can use to do ALL KINDS of learning activities while they practice throwing and catching! We will be making good use of all this wonderful equipment by keeping our kids active inside and outside!

CAAEYC Innovation Grant Award

The Children's Center recently obtained an Innovation Grant Award and has created a Nursing Lounge and Childhood Nutrition Resource Center. This will be presented at the 2106 Capital Area Association for the Education of Young Children annual regional conference to be held at Messiah College on March 5. The resources will be available for check out following the conference and families are invited to peruse them.

Prior to the establishment of the new Nursing Lounge, we worked to accommodate family nursing needs in the Duckling classroom, then through a makeshift, temporary partially enclosed corner of our Large Motor Room. This solution did not provide the necessary privacy, comfort and sanitation.

With this grant and some donations from Dickinson we were able to transform an old storage closet to a comfortable Nursing Lounge. The removal of storage shelves, painting of the walls, laying of carpet and the addition of some furniture, wall hangings, book shelf and lamp table were the first steps to completion of the room. We later purchased new boppy pillows and covers, a white noise machine, bins for storing personal items, a few small infant toys/books and books/pamphlets on topics related to early childhood nutrition from the American Academy of Pediatrics and other vendors. A wall-mounted diaper changing table was installed in the bathroom.

The Nursing Lounge and Childhood Nutrition Resource Center meets all the needs for privacy, comfort, and sanitation for our nursing mothers with easy access to running water, electricity, and refrigeration of expressed milk. It also allows us to share with our families important information on early childhood nutrition and the community resources available to support them.

January has been a month of transitions as we have all returned from a long winter break, have become reacquainted and gradually resettled into our routines.

We are about half-way through our first winter, and although weather conditions so far have kept us indoors for much of January, we have been able to play outside on a number of days. We are still waiting for our first real snowfall! We have explored ideas associated with winter through the scenes that play out beyond our windows, outdoors on our playground, during stroller walks around our neighborhood and on campus and through pictures, books, stories and song.


In February, we will consider the concept of shadows as we observe Ground Hog Day. We will explore shades of the color red and heart shapes in our environment, as well as thoughts of love, nurturing and caring for each other, as we celebrate St. Valentine's Day with related board books and songs. While our curriculum revolves around basic care needs, we will introduce chunky puzzles, more cause & effect toys, puppets and building blocks for the older infants. The "Big Room" will give us lots of space to practice sitting, rolling, crawling, pushing toys, walking, climbing, dancing and rolling balls. We will take nature walks whenever the temperatures permit. We will also continue to incorporate gestures and signing: waving, clapping, pointing, blowing kisses, and others that build on our emerging language development.

With each passing month now, we will celebrate another milestone birthday among our infants, marking young toddlerhood! For those young toddlers who are interested, simple art materials will be introduced, chunky crayons or paper with small blobs of colorful finger paint.

We are excited about the March 5th Pancake Breakfast and hope that you are all planning to attend. The infants will participate in their small way toward the construction of a table center piece! The Duckling silent auction box is in the hallway by the front office if you wish to make a donation. The sign-up sheet with suggested item donations is posted on the infant room door. Our theme this year is Coffee and Chocolate. Also be sure to browse through the Scholastic book brochures that you find in your "go home" bins each month. It's a nice way to build on your baby's book library at home (they do feature board books). You may order on-line or submit your order to the office and with each book purchase you make, the Center gets points toward book purchases to enhance our own classroom library!

This month will have us looking for our shadows. Look for a flashlight (please label) to bring in so we can have fun and make shadows on our wall. We will color a groundhog and see if spring is on its way. Then the puppies will talk about our teeth, what we use them for (eating) and how we keep them clean. We will paint with tooth brushes and sing songs about brushing teeth. The puppies will be talking about feelings and friends as we get ready for Valentine's Day. We will play with red play-doh, color hearts, decorate a bag, and finger paint with red paint. I will be sending home a list of all the kids names. Next we will be working on identifying our colors. Yellow Honey Bees

Well here we are in February already. Wow, where does the time go? We have been very busy in the yellow honey bee room. The week of 2/8-2/12 will bring discussions about feelings. We will focus on all feelings this week, but end up on Friday talking about love. Fun activities for this week include: a lot of craft projects with hearts and talking about how things makes us feel. Please keep an eye out for the list of names for all of the children in our room for valentine's card.

Fact: Approximately 150 million Valentine's Day cards are exchanged annually. This makes Valentine's Day the second most popular card sending holiday after Christmas.

"When I grow up" is a fun theme for the week of 2/15-2/19. We will talk with the kids about what they want to be when they grow up...you might what to keep what they tell us they want to be and show it to them when they are bigger. We will make a list of all the jobs the children can think of, read books about different kinds of jobs. We will take care of babies this week and even give our baby dolls a bath. Being the president of the United States will be a topic of discussion and we will also talk about what moms and dads do.

The theme for the week of 2/22 - 2/26 is "Music makes the world go round." We will listen to different kinds of music and dance all week long, look at and hear different instruments, and even make our own instruments. If any of our families play a musical instrument, and you would like to share with us we would love to have you come in and play

The children all did an awesome job of being teachers on our "Kids Are Teachers Day"! Each child was in charge of one part of the day. Some planned and carried out lessons and center activities, while others led our daily routines, like Meeting Time and News. It was a great leadership experience for the kids, and I saw confidence blossoming in every one of them.

In the weeks preceding our 100th Day of Kindergarten we did a bundle of 100-themed activities. We've done LOTS of counting... by ones, tens, and fives.. and are learning more about place value. Our actual 100th Day, which we will celebrate on January 27, should be tons of fun! We'll hunt for 100 hearts, break a piñata with 100 things inside, and we'll fill our "museum" with the children's 100 Day projects. We're hoping for lots of visitors to come in to visit our 100 Day Museum!

We'll be celebrating Groundhog Day by learning a little bit about shadows. We're hoping the weather will cooperate with us so that we can get outside to do a few shadow experiments, but we'll settle for indoor experiments with flashlights if necessary!

Also in February we'll revisit our study about Health and Nutrition. We'll review about healthy habits and how to prevent germs from spreading. We'll also review the importance of exercise and eating nutritiously, and will learn about dental health, as well.

We'll be celebrating Valentine's Day on February 12. The children may all bring Valentine cards for their peers and we'll do a few Valentine-themed activities that day.

We're planning two weeks of fun and rhyme at the end of February/ early March with "On the Loose With Dr. Seuss and Mother Goose"! We'll play around with rhyming words and alliteration, as we do our share of writing rhymes and stories. A few special days are planned during those weeks. We'll be doing everything in a wacky way on "Wacky Wednesday" (Feb, 24). We'll practice reciting nursery rhymes, dress like a favorite nursery rhyme character, and present our rhymes to some of the younger classes on "Nursery Rhyme Day" (Feb. 26). "Dr. Seuss Day" will be on March 2, Dr. Seuss's actual birthday. That day we'll all come to school dressed like our favorite Dr. Seuss character and will enjoy a Seussy lunch of green eggs and ham and butter side up bread.

DCCC information on:

Weather related closings, delays and early dismissals

Dear Families,

As we are entering the winter season, I want remind you of the following guidelines that pertain to weather related closings, delays and early dismissals.

Closing/delay due to bad weather:

DCCC will be closed when the college is closed due to bad weather (snow/ice). We will continue to notify families via the e-mail distribution list and through the following media outlets:

<u>TV Stations</u>: WGAL Channel 8 (NBC), WHTM Channel 27 (ABC), WPMT FOX 43, WHP Channel 21 (CBS), and WLYH Channel 15 (UPN)

Radio Stations: WHP 580 AM, WRVV 97.3 FM The River, WRBT 94.9 FM BOB, WHKF 99.3 FM KISS, WITF FM 89.5 NPR, WINK 104 FM, WROZ 101.3 FM The Rose, and WI00 1000 AM (Carlisle Station).

In order to provide the utmost safety to the children within the Center, DCCC also reserves the right to decide to close even if the college would remain open.

If the College decides to delay, DCCC too will delay.

On a one hour delay DCCC will open at 8:30 (11:00 arrival policy remains in effect)
On a two hour delay DCCC will open at 9:30 (11:00 arrival policy remains in effect)
DCCC opening at 10:00 a.m. – the 11:00 arrival policy will be extended to 11:30 a.m. to help accommodate the number of children at drop-off.

Once again, if possible we will notify families via the e-mail distribution list and local TV stations.

Early Dismissal:

When the college decides to close early due to worsening weather conditions, DCCC will close as well. However, we will add an hour to our closing time in relation to the college time to allow parents within the community enough time to make arrangements to pick up their child safely. (For example, if the college decides to close at 3:00 p.m., the Center will close at 4:00.)

This message will go out via e-mail distribution list, local TV stations and, when necessary the classroom teachers will call their individual families.

Please keep in mind that the college does not decide to close very frequently. However, when they do, it is necessary that we now follow their same schedule in order to provide the utmost safety to the DCCC staff as well. We will be certain to make sure that the Children's Center is specifically stated in order to avoid confusion.
