### DCCC Spring Reminders!

- **Shoe safety:** Make sure children wear shoes that protect their feet. Please make sure your children wear sneakers or sandals that cover and protect their toes. Rubber clogs and some sandals can be fun and airy, but they may also be too flimsy or loose for running, climbing, or riding trikes and can lead to accidents and injuries.



- **Sunscreen:** Each child should have a bottle of sunscreen to be kept here at the Center. Spray sunscreen is **not** permitted. While convenient, spray sunscreen enters the air and children breathe it in to their bodies. We also apply sunscreen inside, and it creates quite a filmy build up on the floors at the Center. Please bring sunscreen for your child and remember to check expiration dates before sending them in to school.



- **Sun Hats:** In addition to sunscreen, another good way to protect your child's head and face from the sun is a sun hat.
- **Bike Helmets:** In order for the children to be permitted to ride bikes on the playground, they must wear a helmet. Properly fitting helmets are important for the safety of your child while riding. Please check your child's helmet! Providing a helmet for your child to keep at the Center works much better than taking it back and forth from home to school.


May 16-20- Flowers! We will review our colors while we do many crafts like paintings, gluing, and we will plant flowers that week too.







## Bunnies



April has flown by! We started out the month with learning about bugs and insects. We talked about what makes something an insect and learned how to identify those characteristics. We then moved into the week of the young child where we learned about Music, nutrition by making tacos, working together and what that means, art, and fitness. That week was a lot of fun! Then we moved into reduce, reuse, and recycle week. We talked about the Earth and how to care for it, intentionally reduced, reused and recycled during the week and had a no trash/heat up lunch outside. Our Earth day project is still under construction and as soon as it is finished it will be hanging in the hallway. Finally, we rounded out the month with gardens and talked about what things we grow and how to work in a garden.

In May we have a lot of fun lined up as well. We will start off with nutrition where we talk about different food groups, how to eat a balanced meal and how fitness can help our bodies. Then we will move into frogs and tadpoles as we watch them grow in our classroom. We will talk about the life cycle of a frog, what they eat and their habitat. Next, we will move into nursery rhymes and fairy tales. We will focus on a few stories or poems and study how they are similar or different. Finally, we will finish the month with a week on letter and number fun. We will fill up our week with letter games, writing, counting and patterns.

We'll end the month (and school year!) with a "Memories and Moving On" theme. We'll share some of our favorite kindergarten memories and will work on our program for our Kindergarten Graduation. Families and friends are invited to attend our program on June 1 at 6:30 PM. In addition to the program by the kindergartners, there will be a slide show highlighting some of our favorite kindergarten moments.

In addition to our themes, we've got a few special events in the works before the end of our school year. We're looking very forward to the St. Jude's Trike-a-thon on May 5. Please be sure to send a bike or scooter for your child as well as a helmet, permission slip, and pledge sheet.

We've scheduled a trip to Mooreland Elementary School for May 26.
