From the Director's Desk

Welcome to all our families. We can't believe that September has come and gone so quickly. It has been so very nice being able to go outside every day, it is such a change from the hot weather that we had this summer. We were constantly checking the temperature and trying to get the children out early when it was cooler.

Our Enrollment is currently at 110 children, including 98 families. We still have a few toddler openings and a few preschool openings, so please help us spread the word. The waiting list has been placed back on line for the remainder of this year.

DCCC welcomed two new teachers (Ms. Kendra and Ms. Cassie), one new substitute and four new student workers this month. We also are excited that the Shippensburg Education Students will be joining us for one day a week for a total of 10 weeks this semester. Four of the students will be in Bunnies and one student will be in Blue Bears. Kindergarten also has their very own intern from Dickinson that is spending time in their classroom.

I am very excited to share with you about some of the changes made to our Curriculum. Our Blue Bees have gone to monthly themes and have added Mighty Minutes (Transition activities) and the Highlights High Five to their reading corner! Preschool has implemented the Get Set for School Curriculum and the updated Creative Curriculum this fall. I am very pleased with how the teachers have all been working together to incorporate the new ideas into their day while still emphasizing the importance of play.

We are pleased to share that our Summer Camp Programs were very successful this past summer. Results of our Parent Surveys will be shared at both the Parent Meeting and the Advisory Meeting. We will continue to work to make improvements in order to make both camps the very best that they can be.

DCCC has once again received E.I.T.C (Educational Improvement Tax Credit) Scholarship funds. The Scholarships were made available thru the Bravo Foundation and Success by 6 – United Way of Carlisle and Cumberland County. We are delighted that a few of our families qualified for the assistance and were able to take advantage of this wonderful program.

Once again we will be offering Soccer Shots and Martial Arts for ages three and up. It is a great way to introduce children to new experiences while at the same time being in a familiar place.





We are moving into the cold and flu season, so be sure to discuss flu vaccination during your upcoming well baby visits. September brought us a lot of learning as we talked about colors, letters and number, shapes and opposites. We will continue to work on all these areas of learning as the year goes on and will expand on each one as the children show us the need. Also in September, we have been very excited and eagerly wait for the workers to finish our new sandbox on the playground. We have had fun watching them work.

October is sure to bring us more fun as we talk about fall and all the fun things about fall, but first we will talk about health and safety. We will talk about proper handwashing and sneezing into our elbows to keep form spreading germs and fire, bike and car safety. A visit from the fire trucks and an ambulance will also happen this month. We will explore with all our senses apples, pumpkins, leaves and spooky fun. We will also have a fun walk to the HUB to show off our Halloween costumes, all are welcome to look for us as we parade to and through the HUB. Look for permission slip to sign in the days ahead.

Some of us have had a little trouble eating some of our longer pasta and other heat ups with s plastic spoon so if you want to send a fork along we will make sure it gets returned in your child's lunch box.

BUNNIES

September has come to an end and we are finally feeling some Fall temperatures, woo hoo!

We were very busy in September learning all about clothing. We talked about the different features of clothing including sizes, fasteners, and patters/designs. We did some experiments to see which type of soap makes more bubbles when we were talking about how to take care of our clothing. We took a walk past a laundromat and talked about what people do there. The end of September we talked about the jobs that people do where they have to wear special clothing. During this time, we discussed fire safety and we will be finishing up our clothing unit during the first weeks of October with community helpers and finding out what we want to be when we grow up.

After we finish up our clothing unit, we will move into a unit on trees for the second half of October and end with a PJ DAY. During this unit we will learn about different types of trees, who lives in tress, what food comes from trees, how trees change in different seasons and what we can do with different types of trees. We will also be discussing other things that we typically grow or see happening in the fall. We will be doing some baking in this unit, which is always a lot of fun for the class.

- *Also, make sure you are checking labels of what goes into your child's lunch box. We cannot serve anything that says "contains peanuts or tree nuts", "may contain peanuts or tree nuts", "Processed in a facility with peanuts or tree nuts", or mango (it is a tree nut).
