African diaspora. The time in Bremen and Berlin will allow students to immerse themselves in daily culture and learn about different perspectives on ethnicity, nation and diaspora from both community members and associations as well as their peers.

Course experience in Africana Studies, American Studies, Sociology, Anthropology, History, International Studies or German is recommended. **No prior knowledge of the German language is necessary, as the course will be taught in English.**
