One course taught in SPAN at Dickinson programs in Málaga or Mendoza not listed in the Bulletin, not a literature or linguistics course, and on a topic related to Spanish- or Portuguese-speaking world \& culture may count toward the major. Before taking a 400-level course students should complete at least two courses at the 300 level.
