DCCC Summer Reminders!

• <u>Shoe safety:</u> Make sure children wear shoes that protect their feet. Please make sure your children wear sneakers or sandals that cover and protect their toes. Rubber clogs and some sandals can be fun and airy, but they may also be too flimsy or loose for running, climbing, or riding trikes and can lead to accidents and injuries.



- **Sunscreen:** Each child should have a bottle of sunscreen to be kept here at the Center. Spray sunscreen is **not** permitted. While convenient, spray sunscreen enters the air and children breathe it in to their bodies. We also apply sunscreen inside, and it creates quite a filmy build up on the floors at the Center. Please bring sunscreen for your child and remember to check expiration dates before sending them in to school.
- <u>Sun Hats</u>: In addition to sunscreen, another good way to protect your child's head and face from the sun is a sun hat.
- <u>Bike Helmets</u>: In order for the children to be permitted to ride bikes on the playground, they must wear a helmet. Properly fitting helmets are important for the safety of your child while riding. Please check your child's helmet! Providing a helmet for your child to keep at the Center works much better than taking it back and forth from home to school.

Ducklings




May was a month on the GO for the Ducklings. Not only did the infants experience all kinds of "things that go" in book, songs and pictures, but we ventured onto our campus and in our neighborhood to see real dump trucks, diggers, bull dozers, lawn mowers, trains, cars, postal trucks, and so much more! We loved pushing toy vehicles across the floor, under, over and through obstacles and maneuvering push toys and trikes all around the large motor room and on the playground. We even participated in the mini trike-a-thon fund raiser for St. Jude's Children's Hospital. We thank the parents who came out to support us.

June brings summer days and we will play and read on the playground in the cool shade of our big, blue awning. We will paint with water and continue to explore simple art materials: brush painting, finger painting, paper, and crayons...exploring our creativity and developing our fine motor skills. Our young toddlers will begin to learn to walk together in a line on the "bug rope" as they are ready. We will begin practicing sitting in real toddler-size chairs, feed ourselves table foods with utensils and cups, and will continue working toward giving up bottles and morning naps. Within our Big Idea of "Learning About Me and My Friends", we will talk about dressing ourselves, washing our own hands, putting on our sunhats, and putting away our toys. Learning about ourselves also includes learning about our feelings and about the feelings of our friends. We will label feelings and work on coping with some of the feelings of young toddlerhood, as well as how to live happily with our little friends with kindness, gentle touches and taking turns.

We will continue our nature walks and our visits to the Children's Garden to water, harvest and observe the growth and the wild life (bumblebees and butterflies!) that are evident in the garden. We will continue to observe the growth and development of our tadpoles. We will experience the myriad shapes and colors of flags in recognition of "Flag Day". Another busy, fun month ahead!
