African Americans in Cuba mini-Mosaic

January-Spring 2018



The Cuba mini-Mosaic will take place between **Jan. 6 to Jan. 18, 2018** with a focus on contemporary Afro-Cuban experience, as well as current challenges facing Cuba and its achievements in health care and education. Students will have the opportunity to practice Afro-Cuban music and dance with groups like Raices Profundo in Havana and they will speak with local specialists about the African roots of Santeria. In addition to reflecting on their own experiences while in Cuba, this study tour will prepare students for a critical engagement with the history and politics of African American cultural exchange with Cuba and Cubans from 1859 to 1960. **Students interested in this Mosaic should apply by September 22 to be considered eligible for financial aid.** If accepted, they then will pre-register for the spring course: AFST 320: African Americans in Cuba, 1859 to 1960 to be taught by Prof. Masiki. There are no pre-requisites for the course but it is open only to those students participating in the Mosaic
