Complete the START module.

Incoming students are required to complete the START Learning Program for Higher Education prior to the start of their first semester. The START Program is an online series of well-researched educational programs for adults committed to thinking about their life choices and values. It includes modules aimed at reducing campus sexual assault, dating/domestic violence and stalking; empowering bystanders of potentially violent situations to intervene before the violence occurs; and educating students about alcohol, drugs and their effects. "Alcohol: How Do You Measure Up?" is an assessment tool in the START Program that demonstrates some of the costs of alcohol consumption and lets

students examine their drinking habits and compare them to their peers.

The <u>START Program is available online</u> and all four modules must be completed by August 31.
