DUCKLINGS



March was a busy month in the Duckling room! We spent so much time admiring the shamrocks that were dangling from our ceiling. We were sad to see them go, but the kites that re-

placed them are wonderful! We spent time reading Dr Seuss books, and exploring some new toys. The pop up boxes are some of our new favorites and we are rapidly figuring out how to open each compartment. We also spent a lot of our time filling up and emptying plastic containers. It is a great discovery when we find something that fits inside of them! We are beginning to practice sitting in real toddler-size chairs, feeding ourselves table foods with utensils and cups, and will continue working toward giving up bottles and morning naps. Some of our friends are beginning to transition out of morning naps, so we are being very flexible with the morning schedule during this time. We take time to rest in our cribs, and then move on to other activities if some of the children don't fall asleep.



The month of April ushers in spring and a busy month of activities. It should be safe to take home your baby's snowsuit now and replace it with more appropriate outdoor wear for nature walks and outdoor play. Bear in mind it may still be windy and chilly at times, so layering is usually best. Even though we don't worry too much about footwear indoors, we do need foot protection for outdoor play. Robeez, Pedipeds, or a similar soft sole protective shoe works well for non-walkers and something a little more supportive for walkers. We also ask that you send in sunscreen and sun hats at this time.

Introduction of table foods and self-feeding are big happenings in the infant room right now. Feeding is not only a source of vital nutrition for your baby, but mealtimes are also important learning and social and emotional experiences for young children. Always make sure that foods are cut into small infant-bite size pieces. Review the choking hazard listed posted in the classroom. Meals should include choices that are infant size portions, as well as interesting and varied in terms of flavor, texture, and food groups. Remember, a young child may need to be introduced to a new food as many as 10 times or more before they begin to develop a taste for that food. Others may be more adventurous eaters. Learning to self-feed is a process that can take time and each child has his own preferences. What is important is to expose your baby to foods when they are developmentally ready and to be patient and supportive as they explore and develop this new skill.

The "big idea" of our April lesson plan revolves around spring. Our stories, activities and songs will revolve around this fun theme. We will spend time on the playground observing the seasonal changes around us. We will also be exploring spring flowers, looking for bunnies and birds outside of our windows, and be creating art with a fun spring theme!





BLUE BUSY BEES





BUNNIES






KINDERGARTEN DOLPHINS
