<u>**CHILD ABUSE POLICY UPDATE:</u>** Our child abuse policy has been recently updated to include Shaken Baby Syndrome, Acute Head Trauma, and Child Maltreatment. Teachers have reviewed the updated policy and signed/dated an acknowledgement form. Upon hire and every five years after, all DCCC staff, teachers, and volunteers complete a required Mandated Reporter Training—because we are all mandated reporters of child abuse.</u>

### HiMama Billing Update

Thanks to everyone for your patience over the past month as we transitioned from our super old billing program OfficeCenter to billing through our family communication App, HiMama.



### A few items to note:

- When you submit a check that is an overpayment for future weeks of care, you will not see a running credit on your account—each family has a separate credit ledger that holds that overpayment until those weeks are current and then the credit is applied to the invoice. At this point, there is NOT a way for you to see your credit, but you can always send an e-mail (hellerm@dickinson.edu) and we can check it for you.
- At this point—we do not offer payment through the app—you should continue to pay in your usual ways—check, credit card, cash, or Dickinson's automatic payroll deduction.
- If there are any other questions, please let us know but we feel that this billing program is off to a good start and is a big time saver on our end!

The "big idea" of our April lesson plan revolved around spring. We spent time reading books about the changes we see around

us in the spring, and singing songs about rain, sunshine, and animals. We spent a lot of time on the playground observing the seasonal changes around us. We felt the wind blow in our hair and the warm sunshine. Some days it felt more like fall, but we did our best to enjoy it! We also spent time looking out our windows for birds, bunnies, and squirrels. We have seen dogs, cats, flowers, cars, and like to look for people we know walking by our windows!



Our "big idea" for May is "Things That GO!" We will celebrate things that go in play, in books, songs and in our observations around our neighborhood. We will explore the wheels on push toys and toys cars in our room, explore ramps and tunnels, and make some exciting art with things that go! This is the time of our year together when most of the infants typically have moved away from pureed baby foods and are able to enjoy the delights of table foods! Now that most of the infants are self-feeding, we are beginning to eat in small social groups of four, which is such fun and we learn so much at mealtimes together. We will begin to offer our one-year olds some simple art materials, such as finger paints and chunky crayons. These art activities can be fun and creative, while strengthening and training the little hand muscles. We look forward to sharing our early masterpieces with you!

## **BLUE PUPPIES**



We had so much fun with our Spring month! The puppies enjoyed all the books we had out to read, coloring eggs, painting flowers, playing with plastic eggs and baskets and watching our grass grow!

This month, the puppies will be exploring animals. We will focus on a different "group" of animals each week.

The puppies are going to explore farm animals first. We will color a cow, glue cotton balls on paper to make sheep, finger paint "mud" for our pigs and of course sing "Old McDonald".

Next we will look at ocean animals. They will finger paint a starfish, color a shark, and make a paper plate octopus. We will have ocean animals in our sensory bin.

We won't have to go far to look for wild animals such as alligators, lions, and elephants. We will make paper plate snakes and color a tiger! The puppies will sing our favorite song about monkeys teasing an alligator.

If you have pets at home, bring in a picture of them as we talk about the animals we have at home. We will color a cat and/or dog, and paint a gold fish, and read the book <u>My Pet</u>.

Every week we will talk about what noises these animals make and where they live. We will read lots of books and sing songs. If you have any books about any of these animals, please feel free to share with us.

The puppies are becoming very strong with our colors, and wanting to count!

I think the weather is finally starting to warm up, but please keep a sweater or light jacket for those cool mornings. We are getting the hang of "flipping" our coats to put them on!
