From the Director's Desk

November is a fast-paced month at DCCC! We have lots of fun days planned going forward so please be sure to check in on our weekly emails and classroom calendars! Fall Conferences went very well. It is always a great time to meet with your child's teacher and to learn about your child's day. We were especially pleased to be doing conferences in person once again.

We hope that all those that attended the DCCC Family event for Trick or Treating enjoyed seeing all the teachers dressed up and liked the little treats that were handed out. Our classroom parades for the Fall Harvest parties took place on the 28th at 10:00 AM. Families gathered out front of the center to see the children ages preschool and up parade in their dress up costumes.

The Advisory Committee has welcomed two new community members and two new college members: Ellen Hanna, Kristin Strock, Holley Friedlander, and Lauren Mishoe. Their bios were sent out through HiMama. They will have their first meeting for the school year in November. The Advisory members meet bi-monthly and take part in providing input for the center events, policies, and procedures.

Both Blue Bear and the Bunny classroom teachers continue to meet monthly with Kris Woody (M.Ed. PA Program-wide & School-wide Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports Facilitator), to discuss classroom challenges, routines, and daily schedules. The PBIS Core Team continues to also discuss implementing Positive Behavior Supports within the classrooms. Both Ms. Mandy and Ms. Jody are scheduled to attend the Implementor's Forum in Hershey at the end of the month. All teachers are required to obtain a minimum twelve hours of training by November including topics such as child development, health and safety and assessment. The center is once again inviting therapists and teacher supports into our classrooms to offer individual child services but to also help provide suggestions and share in collaboration with our teachers. Our goal is to help each child be successful in their day here at DCCC!

DCCC has a few big maintenance plans scheduled to occur over the next few months. We will be replacing the bathroom faucets and some of the very old cabinetry at the infant/toddler end of the building. We are also looking into finding a company to repair and seal the rubber surface on the playgrounds, doing some touch up painting on the climbers and painting within the center as well.

The following guideline will be placed in the DCCC Family Handbook in the spring of 2023 however, effective immediately, when a child is absent or leaves early due to illness, that they should not be permitted to attend extra Center activities (soccer, dance, family special events) until the child returns to care. In order to keep the children and families as healthy as possible, children who are absent due to illness should remain at home until it is determined that they can safety participate in the day at DCCC.

BLUE BUSY BEES

During the month of October, we talked about apples how they grow on a tree and that they can be made into many yummy treats. The children had fun helping to make our apple snack by using their muscles to peel, core and slice up the apples. We also talked about pumpkins and gourds. We learned that both apples and pumpkins come from a very tiny seed planted into the ground. We

also learned that while and apple grown up on a tree and pumpkin grows down on the ground upon a vine. The month was finished up with a spooky fun week. Reading books about trick-or-treating was fun and we had a Halloween costume party in our classroom. We are working on recognizing the letters in our names, counting from 1-10 and recognizing those numbers as well. We continue to work on following directions in the classroom as well as when we are outside and cleaning up our toys when it is time to move onto another activity. The blue bees are also learning to use their words to convey their wants and needs to their teachers and friends and learning to understand and respect their friend's feelings and words. Now that we have coat weather, the children will also be learning to put their own coats on with the coat flip, ask your little one to show you how it works, it is a great way for them to learn to put their coat on independently. PBIS Spotlight: SOLUTION BOARD

The preschool classrooms have many strategies to help the children develop their social and emotional skills. One of the strategies they use is a Solution Board. The Solution Board is an area in each of the preschool classrooms that provides visual cues to assist in solving problems. The Solution Board helps with problems such as wanting something a friend has, taking turns, and sharing. When using the board, the teachers help the children identify their feelings at that time, and help them talk through the solution with their classmates that are involved with the problem.

KINDERGARTEN DOLPHINS




October was a very busy and fun month! Color days, community helpers and career day, pumpkin discoveries, costume day and a fall harvest party and a trick or treat night!

We are loving having our student teacher Ms. Elizabeth and our Language teacher Ms. Julia who have continued to come in and work with us.

We learned the color words and had a lot of fun dressing up for our color days to help us practice them. In Literacy, we have been learning about the parts of a book as well as different parts of a story; like

characters, setting, problem and solution and have been practicing retelling the stories we have been reading. During our writing time we have been enjoying writing in our kid writing journals! We have been practicing being the Illustrators where we have leaned how to tell stories with pictures. We have learned how to add details and colors to our pictures, we learned how to share, and even to label our work! We discovered the "glue" of our writing time which is conferencing where a teacher meets with the student to discuss their writing. We are continuing to practice our handwriting and doing new lessons with Ms. Ashley to learn new letters.



This month is science we have been learning about trees, leaves, fall, and pumpkins. We have been discussing life cycles and making observations about pumpkins.

In November, we have more excitement in store! We will be learning about nocturnal and diurnal animals, being thankful and Thanksgiving. We will be continuing to work on story elements, retelling, learn 2 of our digraphs, segmenting, and blending. In math we will continue to practice pocket problems and start number stories. We will also be starting monthly visits from the Bosler Library which we are very excited about.
