
- "Flipping" Class Instruction

- Livestream campus events or guest lectures






Use-Cases in Teaching & Learning (student-created)

- Think-aloud videos
- Alternative format for students with disabilities affecting writing.
- Physical skill exhibitions
 - Field Work
 - Art (record creation process)
 - Dance
- Document lab chemical reactions
- Record Oral Histories or Other Interviews
- General presentations
- Group Book Discussions
- Asynchronous Online Discussion Boards or Role-play simulations


