Graduating Seniors Report Class of 2022

- The Class of 2022 is composed of 509 graduates
- 57% of the Class of 2022 graduated with Latin Honors (n=288): 10% summa cum laude, 23% magna cum laude, and 23% cum laude
- 44 students (9% of the class) graduated with departmental honors (honors theses)
- 71% of graduates were awarded a Bachelor of Arts degree (n=363); 29% were awarded a Bachelor of Science degree (n=146)
- 58% of the Class of 2022 are women (n=294) and 42% are men (n=215)
- 22% of the graduating class are students of color (n=113) (excluding international students)
 There are 29 African Americans, 43 Hispanic Americans, 22 Asian Americans, 18 multi-ethnic,
 and 1 American Indian or Alaska Native
- Members of the Class of 2022 reside in 30 states and the District of Columbia. 25% are from in-state. After Pennsylvania, most come from New Jersey (11%), New York (9%), and Maryland (9%)
- 76 graduates are citizens from 19 foreign countries
- 30 graduating seniors are direct legacies (whose parents are alums). Another 25 are related to other Dickinson graduates such as siblings, aunts, uncles, grandparents, etc.

Majors and Minors

- 75% (n=382) of graduating seniors graduated with one major; 24% were double majors (n=123) and 4 seniors are graduating with triple majors
- 4% of graduating seniors majored in the Arts (n=22)
- 29% of graduating seniors majored in the sciences (n=146)
- 53% of graduating seniors majored in an "interdisciplinary" field (n=272)
- 31% of graduating seniors majored in an "international" area (n=157)
- 42% of the class graduated with a declared minor (n=250). The most popular minors were: economics; Spanish studies; film & media studies; French & Francophone studies; Italian; mathematics; educational studies; religion; Arabic; Chinese

Engaging the World

- 21% of this graduating class studied off campus at some point during their undergraduate years (n=108)
- 18% of this graduating class studied abroad during their undergraduate years (n=93)
- 16% of men (34/215) and 20% of women (59/294) studied abroad
- 21% of students of color (24/113); 17% of international graduates (13/76) and 10% of first-generation graduates studies abroad (8/79)
- 9% of science majors studied abroad (14/149); 14% of athletes studied abroad (22/152)
- 18 students participated in off campus study programs in the United States, such as the Washington Center Internship Program
- 2% of graduates participated in a Mosaic or Globally Integrated Course. Areas of study included climate change, human security, the arts, natural history, sustainability, cultural migrations, leadership and human resources, and public health and disasters response (n=9)
- 6 graduating seniors have been awarded a Fulbright this year; 1 informed the
 college they have accepted positions as a teacher with Teach for America, and 7
 received their commission into the US Army as 2nd Lieutenants through our ROTC
