Graduating Seniors Report Class of 2023

- The Class of 2023 is composed of 371 graduates
- 53% of the Class of 2023 graduated with Latin Honors (n=201): 15% summa cum laude, 20% magna cum laude, and 19% cum laude
- 37 students (10% of the class) graduated with departmental honors (honors theses)
- 72% of graduates were awarded a Bachelor of Arts degree (n=267); 28% were awarded a Bachelor of Science degree (n=104)
- 57% of the Class of 2023 are women (n=212) and 43% are men (n=159)
- 20% of the graduating class are students of color (n=76) (excluding international students) There are 17 African Americans, 27 Hispanic Americans, 18 Asian Americans, 13 multi-ethnic, and 1 American Indian or Alaska Native
- Members of the Class of 2023 reside in 30 states and the District of Columbia. 27% are from in-state. After Pennsylvania, most come from Maryland (11%), New York (9%), and New Jersey (8%)
- 37 graduates are citizens from 14 foreign countries
- 17 graduating seniors are direct legacies (whose parents are alums). Another 27 are related to other Dickinson graduates such as siblings, aunts, uncles, grandparents, etc.

Majors and Minors

- 72% (n=268) of graduating seniors graduated with one major; 27% were double majors (n=101) and 2 seniors are graduating with triple majors
- 5% of graduating seniors majored in the Arts (n=18)
- 28% of graduating seniors majored in the sciences (n=104)
- 48% of graduating seniors majored in an "interdisciplinary" field (n=178)
- 30% of graduating seniors majored in an "international" area (n=111)
- 40% of the class graduated with a declared minor (n=150). The most popular minors were: economics; Spanish & Portuguese studies, creative writing, French and Francophone studies, ethics; film & media studies; Arabic; art & art history; philosophy; and biology;

Engaging the World

- 34% of this graduating class studied off campus at some point during their undergraduate years (n=125)
- 34% of this graduating class studied abroad during their undergraduate years (n=125)
- 25% of men (39/159) and 41% of women (86/212) studied abroad
- 37% of students of color (28/76); 32% of international graduates (13/41) and 26% of first-generation graduates studies abroad (12/46)
- 20% of science majors studied abroad (21/105); 24% of athletes studied abroad (24/102)
- 3 students participated in off campus study programs in the United States, such as the Washington Center Internship Program
- 2% of graduates participated in a Mosaic or Globally Integrated Course. Areas of study included climate change, human security, the arts, natural history, sustainability, cultural migrations, leadership and human resources, and public health and disasters response (n=7)
- 4 graduating seniors has been awarded a Fulbright this year; 1 informed the college they have accepted a position as a teacher with Teach for America, 1 joined the Peace Corps and 5 received their commission into the US Army as 2nd Lieutenants through our ROTC program
