From the Director's Desk



We had our share of cold weather, so we are ready for Spring!

The Children's Center Kindergarten Program is full for the 2024-25 school year. If interested in the Kindergarten Program, full day or Kindergarten only (9-3PM), please contact the center office because we do currently have a wait list. We

continue to offer options for tuition and will work to help create a schedule to fit your family's needs. We continue to work with the college to implement a cultural program as well as a language program within our Kindergarten curriculum for the fall and spring semester.

It's that time of year again to start preparing for our Summer School Age Program. Both camps will begin June 3rd and run until August 9th. We will be hiring a few returning students to help us out for the summer, and we cannot wait to get started. Currently, we are scheduling activities for the camp programs. If interested in enrolling in the Summer School Age Program, please feel free to call the center office for availability, we do have a wait list for this program as well.

During February, all staff and substitutes were trained in both Fire Safety and Emergency Preparedness. Staff reviewed the hands on steps in using a fire extinguisher and discussed evacuation procedures. Emergency Relocations and the steps involved in an Intruder Drill were also discussed and reviewed at this time.

We have been working very hard on our projections for our fall class assignments. Information about the fall move ups will be shared at the Spring conferences. These conferences will be offered in the evening on April 25 with a few rooms having daytime meetings as well. It will be a great time to discuss your child's current development and their projected move up. Once all groups are set, we will begin the enrollment process for the new children.

The Children's Center will be closed on March 15th for a training day. Some of the teachers and substitutes will renew their Pediatric First Aid/CPR certification while other staff will renew online trainings, complete classroom work, and various small group teacher meetings throughout the day. At the end of the day, all staff will attend a staff meeting and complete the day with a team building game.

Update on DCCC Security, hours update, and staffing changes:

March is a fun month of transition to spring! We will watch for the early signs of spring, and experience kite-shapes and green shamrocks in our classroom environment. We will paint and color in shades of green. We will listen to Celtic music, and dance with rainbow ribbons. We will continue to label our body parts and our feelings, as we learn more about ourselves. As of March, two of our classmates have entered officially into the stage of young toddler with their milestone first birthdays, and a few more are getting so very close! It is a stage of increasing independence. We will practice washing hands, putting away our toys, self-dressing, eating solids from spoons and forks, drinking from sippy cups and self-feeding simple table foods. Young toddlers are ready to give up being spoon fed pureed foods and they love the newfound independence of being able to feed themselves...great for their fine motor development and their self-esteem! Always introduce new foods at home before sending them in to the Center to be sure your baby doesn't have a food sensitivity. Review the choking hazard list and remember we are a peanut-free and tree nut-free center (this includes mango, which surprisingly is considered a member of the tree nut family). Our one -year-olds will gradually wean themselves from their bottle feedings over the course of the coming months. Our younger group of infants learn so much by watching and by engaging in the activities of the older ones. Now, let's get ready to celebrate spring!

February gave us all the feels! February brought us Valentine's Day, where we discussed ways to show other people how much we care. We took the time to discuss all our emotions—big ones, little ones, and all the feelings in between. We are showing our teachers how we can manage our own emotions and how to seek help when our emotions get too big

handle all by ourselves. It made us all feel so proud to spread kindness around our school!

We will kick off March celebrating Read Across America! Our Creative Curriculum Books unit will introduce us to authors and illustrators. We'll explore books inside and out, learning about what makes a story. We will be able to tell the difference between a fiction book and a nonfiction book. We'll even create our own classroom book!

Here is hoping March comes in like a lamb instead of a lion (February was COLD and SNOWY!) March will be a fun month learning about the weather. The students will put their own spin on it



by wanting to learn weather words in Spanish! They will be able to tell you "sunny" in Spanish is "soleado", "partly cloudy" is "parcialmente nublado", and "cold" is "frio". Their favorite weather word, which we forecast a lot is, "windy" which is "hace viento". We noticed that the weather temperature was starting to gradually rise towards the end of February, and that the warmer weather signals to a lot of the animals that

were hibernating that it is wake up time soon. An animal that hibernates is the frog! We will jump right into this study with a lot

interest! We used non-fiction books to give us facts about frogs. We will learn about their habitats, what the difference is between a frog and a toad, and that frogs are a kind of Amphibian! We will also read some fiction books that are silly but teach us useful life lessons! You might hear that we have a special vis-

itor in our room, who happens to be a frog, and his name is Hoppy (Stuffed animal \square). He helps us remember and rewards us when we follow our DCCC 3B rules; Be safe, be kind, be responsible! **RECAP:**

Responding promptly to replacing your children's extra clothing is very helpful to us. Our class-room extra clothing bin is running slim, but we won't need to dip into it if your child's extra clothing bin is equipped with what they need. If you are unsure of what your child's extra clothing bin has inside it, we can double check it at drop off or pick up. On a day-to-day basis if they use any clothing from their extra clothing bins, we are sure to put a note on the soiled clothing letting you know what they will need in order to replace what we used.

In Kindergarten, we are working on the "be kind and be responsible" components of DCCCs big 3. We are working hard on problem solving and conflict resolution. It is important to practice and really draw at-



tention to learning how to appropriately work through a problem with a friend, listen to someone else's ideas, and how to keep working through something that might feel frustrating. We are also working on being responsible and following the classroom rules and making sure our work is done.
