This is the time of our year together when most of the infants typically have moved away from pureed baby foods and are able to enjoy the delights of table foods! Now that most of the infants are self-feeding, we are beginning to eat in small social groups of four, which is such fun and we learn so much at mealtimes together. We will begin to offer our one-year olds some simple art materials, such as finger paints and chunky crayons. #### PBIS


