 - The <u>Panel Study of Income Dynamics (PSID</u>), begun in 1968, is the world's longest-running multigenerational household panel study. It is used to investigate scientific and policy questions about life course trajectories in health and well-being, intergenerational social and economic mobility, income and wealth inequality, family investments in children, neighborhood effects on opportunity and achievement, and many other topics.

This **five-day**, **in-person only**, workshop will orient participants to the content and structure of the core PSID interview, its special topics modules, and its supplemental studies, including the Child Development Supplement (CDS) and the Transition into Adulthood Supplement (TAS). In addition, we will discuss topics including the recently-released and newly collected genomics data collected from 2014-2023 as well as new data files which explain family relationships and demographic characteristics over time.

• **REMINDER ON OUTGOING FUNDING PROPOSALS:** Please remember to inform the Sponsored Projects Office (Ben) of all your outgoing funding proposals. This includes those which are institutionally sponsored, or if they are for grants, fellowships, residencies, prizes or other sabbatical or research support that might come to you directly. This is a responsibility of faculty members according to the Faculty Handbook Chapter I, Sect. IV, Part A.1-3, and in Sponsored Project Policies in the Campus Policies Manual under "Approval and Submission of Proposals."

You are also required to lodge a copy of your proposal with the Sponsored Projects Office. This information assists in the preparation of College and community-wide publicity, and helps your colleagues learn of your scholarly work and have an opportunity to learn of its depth and breadth. It can also be highly useful for pre-tenure and tenure reviews, promotions, salary increases, awards, and conferral of named chairs.

NIH rate change blocked by federal judge – February 10, 2025

A federal judge issued a restraining order that placed a temporary pause nationwide on plans by the NIH to cap indirect cost rates.

<u>Federal Court Filing regarding NIH Grants Policy Statement: Indirect Cost Rates</u> – February 10, 2025 Twenty-two states file to block indirect cost rate cap.

Supplemental Guidance to the 2024 NIH Grants Policy Statement: Indirect Cost Rates – February 7, 2025 The NIH announced an indirect cost rate cap of 15% for new and existing grants. The new rate, which is proposed to go into effect February 10, replaces previously negotiated rates with universities and research institutions.

<u>SPIN</u> (Sponsored Programs Information Network) provides up-to-date information on current national and international government and private funding sources, including fellowships, research grants, publication support, sabbatical support, curriculum development, and more. Accessible to anybody on campus using Dickinson's internet connection. SPIN is also accessible to anybody off campus after a SPIN profile has been established. If you would like to create a SPIN profile and receive summaries of grant opportunities based on keywords related to your research sent automatically to you by email, please contact <u>Ben</u>.

If you find a funding opportunity using SPIN, notify <u>Ben</u> so that we can assist you with the proposal preparation and submission processes.

- Think Ahead for Funding of Sabbaticals and Projects! If you are planning to take sabbatical leave or implement a project, <u>NOW</u> is the time to look for grant funding support. Contact <u>Ben</u> to assist you with researching grant opportunities that match your funding needs.
- <u>MEMBERS OF THE FACULTY</u>: If a student approaches you and requests assistance with submitting electronic grant proposals (via grants.gov, research.gov, etc.), please direct them to the <u>Sponsored Projects Office</u> for assistance.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM FINANCIAL OPERATIONS

• Ensuring that all awards and grants are duly recognized by the college and properly reflected in the financial records is important. All award funds or notifications of wire/ACH transactions should be sent to <u>Stacey Mackes</u> in Financial Operations for proper identification and to coordinate deposit and recording within Banner. After identification, the Gift Recorder (<u>Patty Zink</u>) will then enter the deposit in Banner to the fund restricted to that award and records them in the college's Advancement's records. The <u>College Advancement</u> and <u>Financial Operations</u> offices work together

closely to make sure this process captures all college awards. <u>If you receive an award, please be sure to contact Stacey</u> <u>Mackes to assist you in ensuring that your funding is accounted for properly from start to finish.</u>

- <u>Cost Share Guidelines</u>: If a proposal requires cost sharing, the commitment of institutional resources must be noted on the <u>External Grant Notification/Clearance Form</u> that is circulated among the senior officers of the college for approval. If the college receives the award that includes cost sharing in the approved budget, the college is obligated to record these costs in the financial records and these cost share expenses are subject to audit. Please be sure to discuss cost sharing with the <u>Sponsored Projects Office</u> and/or <u>Financial Operations</u> offices prior to submitting proposals.
- Every grant or award has a unique account number (called FOAPAL) to track activity specific to that award. These numbers are assigned by Financial Operations when award letters are received. <u>Stacey Mackes</u> tracks activity in accounts and sends quarterly spreadsheets to Financial Managers for their information and review. As a Financial Manager, you can review real time expenditures via Banner Self-Service. Please contact <u>Stacey</u> to inquire about Self-Service training offerings and direct to her specific questions about finances on awards.
- If you have recommendations about information that would be useful for managing your grants (additional analysis, open sessions, Banner training, one-on-one assistance, etc.), please contact <u>Stacey Mackes</u>.
