Springtime Center Safety Reminders:

• Shoe safety: Please make sure children wear sneakers or sandals that protect their tiny toes and feet. Rubber clogs and some sandals can be fun and airy, but they may also be too flimsy or loose for running, climbing, or riding trikes and can lead to accidents and injuries.



• <u>Sunscreen:</u> Each child should have a bottle of sunscreen to be kept here at the Center. Spray sunscreen is **not** permitted. While convenient, spray sunscreen enters the air and children breathe it in to their bodies. We also apply sunscreen inside, and it creates quite a filmy build up on the floors at the Center. Please bring sunscreen for your child and remember to check expiration dates before sending them in to school.

• **Sun Hats:** In addition to sunscreen, another good way to protect your child's head and face from the sun is a sun hat.



• **<u>Bike Helmets</u>**: In order for the children to be permitted to ride bikes on the playground, they must wear a helmet (Bees and older). Properly fitting helmets are important for the safety of your child while riding. Please check your child's helmet!

Running errands and travelling can be a challenge, but if you prepare and communicate the expectations with your child, the trip will be enjoyable for everyone. Here are a few tips to making errands or travel more enjoyable.

Making Life Easier: Running Errands

- Use a transition warning (e.g., verbal, timer, count down, sing a song).
- Tell your child where you will be going.
 - Use "First..., Then..." statements.
 - Use a Travel Book.
 - · Include one of your child's favorite places.
 - Provide a transition object (toy, blankie, book, travel book, etc.).
 - Provide 2 or 3 choices for the transition object.
- Prepare a cooler.
- Prepare your **diaper bag** or a backpack (written list in bag).
- ★ Getting in the Car Seat:
 - Make getting to the car a game (sing, skip, hop, race, count to 10).

- Make buckling up in his car a game (sing, encourage child's your child's help).
- Show a picture of him safely buckled in his seat.
 Keep it in his travel book.
- Insist that everybody has their seatbelts on before the car moves.
- Provide your child choices.
 - · Your child could choose music, toys, books, etc.
- Make your car a "child friendly" place.
 - Keep an activity bin in the car. Rotate the contents every now and then. Allow your child to choose some of the contents.
 - Play children's music CDs. Provide 2 or 3 choices.
 Sing together.
 - Cool or heat car in advance. Provide a means for your child to communicate how he feels.

ing really hard on learning how to pedal the



As we spend more time in the sun, please be sure to apply sunscreen to your child before coming to the Center, and I will be happy to reapply it later in the day.

The first theme of May, we will be learning about the differences and similarities between frogs and toads, as well as their life cycles. We will also be taking care of tadpoles as our class pets. It will be very exciting to watch them change before our eyes through the process of metamorphosis!

The second theme of May will be focusing on bugs, insects, and gardening. Which types of bugs/ insects are good for our environment and which ones could be harmful? What do bugs and insects do for our gardens?



Yay it's May and the weather is finally getting warmer! The Blue Bears have enjoyed some extra time outside in the sunshine! Please take a minute to check your child's extra clothes bin by the bathroom to ensure they have seasonally appropriate clothing.

Thank you for meeting with Ms. Ashley for conferences. It is always nice to talk to families about their children and show them all the growth they have had in Blue Bears!

As we head into May, we will spend a week talking about plants and flowers. We will learn about the different parts of plants and what they need to grow. If you have a garden at home take some time this month to have your child help you plant various flowers or plants!



During the remainder of the month, we will focus on creepy crawlies (insects)! We will learn that certain types of insects help the environment. We will also discuss the life cycles of lady bugs, butterflies, frogs, and birds.

The last week of May we will spend some time learning about sun safety to prepare us for the summer months ahead.

During the month of May, we will finish up our letters of week with X, Y, and Z! Which means we will have learned all 26 letters of the alphabet! We will


KINDERGARTEN DOLPHINS
