## Graduating Seniors Report Class of 2024

The Class of 2024 is composed of 460 graduates

58% of the Class of 2024 graduated with Latin Honors (n=269): 17% summa cum laude, 23% magna cum laude, and 18% cum laude

45 students (10% of the class) graduated with departmental honors (honors theses)

68% of graduates were awarded a Bachelor of Arts degree (n=311); 32% were awarded a Bachelor of Science degree (n=149)

61% of the Class of 2021 are women (n=281) and 39% are men (n=179)

23% of the graduating class are students of color (n=105) (excluding international students) There are 21 African Americans, 39 Hispanic or Latino, 25 Asian Americans, and 20 multiethnic students.

Members of the Class of 2024 reside in 29 states. (24%, n=109) are from in-state. After Pennsylvania, most come from New Jersey (13%, n=60), Maryland (10%, n=45), and New York (7%, n=32)

45 graduates are citizens from 20 foreign countries

16 graduating seniors are direct legacies (whose parents are alums), including 2 children of alumni couples. Another 13 are related to other Dickinson graduates such as siblings, aunts, uncles, grandparents, etc.

### **Majors and Minors**

78% (n=361) of graduating seniors graduated with one major; 21% were double majors (n=197) and 2 seniors are graduating with triple majors

5% of graduating seniors majored in the Arts (n=24)

32% of graduating seniors majored in the sciences (n=149)

50% of graduating seniors majored in an "interdisciplinary" field (n=229)

25% of graduating seniors majored in an "international" area (n=113)

42% of the class graduated with a declared minor (n=191). The most popular minors were: economics; French and Francophone studies; music; art & art history; film & media studies; creative writing; ethics; educational studies; English; & Italian.

### **Engaging the World**

- 52% of this graduating class studied off campus at some point during their undergraduate years (n=240)
- 39% of men (70/179) and 60% of women (169/281) studied abroad
- 50% of students of color (53/105); 44% of international graduates (19/43) and 49% of first-generation graduates studies abroad (38/78)
- 46% of science majors studied abroad (69/151); 48% of athletes studied abroad (58/122)
- 8 students participated in off campus study programs in the United States, such as the Washington Center Internship Program
- 1% of graduates participated in a Mosaic or Globally Integrated Course. Areas of study included climate change, human security, the arts, natural history, sustainability, cultural migrations, leadership and human resources, and public health and disasters response (n=6)
- 4 graduating seniors have been awarded a Fulbright this year; 1 informed the
  college they have accepted positions as a teacher with Teach for America, 3 joined
  the Peace Corps and 6 received their commission into the US Army as 2<sup>nd</sup>
  Lieutenants through our ROTC program
