Chartered in 1783, Dickinson was the first college established in the newly recognized United States of America.

Founder: Dr. Benjamin Rush, signer of the Declaration of Independence, early member of antislavery societies, prominent physician, medical advisor to the Lewis and Clark Expedition, and “Father of American Psychiatry.”

Namesake: John Dickinson, “Penman of the Revolution,” author of *Letters from a Farmer* and *Articles of the Confederation*, and served as Governor of Delaware and Pennsylvania.
