## N. M. Eberly To Retire Jan. 27

Former Editor Of Evening Sentinel

Norman M. Eberly, information specialist with the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, will retire on Jan. 27 after 50 years in news and information work. He is a former editor of THE EVENING SENTINEL.

He is editor of the Weekly News Bulletin, a publication devoted to news of department activities and of the Commonwealth's agriculture. Recently he prepared the report of the Governor's Committee on Agriculture. He has done promotional work on the State Farm Show, Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition and the All-American Dairy Show. He has been identified with the Farm Show for the past 23 years and with the Dairy Show from its inception in 1964.

Active also in many related activities in agriculture, he initiated the proposal for staging the 1968 National Plowing Matches at Hershey, site of the 1958 national meet.

Formerly with the Pennsylvania State University, he was news editor of the Cooperative Extension Service for 18 years before joining the department on July 1, 1962.

### Dickinson Graduate

A native of Shermans Dale, Perry County, he attended public school there and later graduated from Shippensburg State College and Dickinson College. At Dickinson, he defrayed expenses by working on the side for the Harrisburg Patriot of which he later was city editor. He was editor of The Dickinsonian, college weekly, and worked for a number of years as editor of THE EVENING SENTINEL.

He was principal for a year of the elementary school at Mt. Union and during World War I served with the Army.

He is a member of Sigma Delta Chi, journalism professional society; Pennsylvania Public Relations Society, the Keystoneans, Theta Chi Fraternity, Epsilon Sigma Pi, extension professional fraternity, and Masonic Lodge.

He is a life member of the American Association of Agricultural College Editors and of the Extension Professors Association at Penn State. A former Rotarian, he is a past president of the Carlisle club.

He is married to the former Mary W. Keeny, Harrisburg. They have a son, Dr. Joseph H., Rochester, N. Y.; two daughters, Mrs. Edward L. Evans, III, Philadelphia, and Susan K., Harrisburg, and three grandchildren.
