Monday, April 23, 2018

- Full-day bus trip includes a visit to Frigiliana (voted the "prettiest village in Andalusía"), a delicious lunch with spectacular scenery, and a stop in the town of Nerja (the "jewel of the Costa") with time at Playa de Burriana. And don't forget your camera—our stop at Balcón de Europa provides magnificent views up and down the coast. (\$110)
- Evening tapas and wine tasting in the **historic district** of Málaga (\$55)

Tuesday, April 24, 2018

- Morning tours of Casa Natal Picasso, birthplace of the world-famous artist, in the heart of the historic center of Málaga; and the Museo de Málaga, in the impressive Palacio de la Aduana, with a group lunch at the museum's rooftop restaurant (\$60)
- Afternoon visit to Museo Picasso, which lays out the artist's work in roughly chronological order, showing how it evolved over time. Then we head up to the historic Castillo de Gibralfaro and Alcazaba Fortress, which sit high above the city. (\$50)

• Evening Spanish cooking class: Learn to cook some delicious regional recipes with our hands-on Spanish cooking class, then enjoy the traditional southern Spanish art of **flamenco music and dancing** with the band Amigos del Rocio. (\$125)

Thursday, April 26, 2018

• Morning private VIP tour of the **Museo Carmen Thyssen**, which houses paintings amassed by one of the world's foremost art collectors over the past 30 years. The permanent collection consists of 230 works, mainly by 19th-century Spanish artists. (\$30)

• Afternoon walking tour of **Centro Historico**, including a tour of **Palacio** del Obispo (Bishop's Palace), which houses a collection of religious paintings and effigies, and the Roman Theatre, the oldest monument in Málaga City and the only remaining Roman ruins in Andalucia (\$30)

• Full-day bus trip to the magnificent Alhambra Palace, one of Spain's major tourist attractions; a group lunch at **Parador de San Nicolás** with its dramatic views; then on to picturesque Granada, a city rich in history

• Dinner is on your own this evening.

• Art workshop with a local artist, lunch on your own, then tour the Pompidou Centre (\$100) -OR-

• Take a full-day **bus trip** to the breathtaking cliff walk along **The King's** Pathway of El Caminito del Rey, lunch on your own, and enjoy a winery tour and tasting in the small town of Alora (\$100)

What to Expect:

The itinerary and restaurants have been selected well ahead of time but may need to be adapted if issues arise, regarding weather, ease of access, transportation or other factors. Enjoying the local cuisine will be a highlight of this trip; every attempt will be made to accommodate travelers with dietary restrictions.

Activity Level:

Guests should be able to enjoy an hour of walking at a time, be sure-footed on cobbled surfaces and walk up and down stairs without assistance.

Payment and Cancellations:

The fee for the events you select on the online registration form is due at the time of registration. We accept Visa, MasterCard, American Express and Discover. Event fees are fully refundable up to Dec. 22, 2017. Cancellations before March 22, 2018, will be fully refunded less an administrative fee of \$500 per person. We encourage participants to purchase trip-cancellation insurance for their airline and hotel reservations.

The trip includes:

- tickets/entrance fees to museums and attractions as well as local taxes and service charges

- ground transportation to/from the excursions
