All students with academic accommodations are now able to convey to their professors their eligibility for and intended use of accommodations through what's called the "Access Plan" in CLIQ. (Click this link for <u>Access Plan written and video tutorial guidance</u>.)

Clark has been advised to (1) forward you this Accommodation Letter, (2) schedule a meeting with you, and (3) disclose to you through the CLIQ Access Plan, his intended use of accommodation(s) for your class. Once you have met to confidentially and thoughtfully discuss which and how each accommodation will be implemented, you should "acknowledge" Clark's submission in CLIQ to formalize the Access Plan. ADS will receive an electronic confirmation of the plan that you and Clark made.

Clark has acknowledged that accommodations cannot be provided retroactively. If, however, a change to the Access Plan is warranted later in the semester, Clark can submit to you his modified accommodation intentions that you would then "acknowledge" in CLIQ.

Summer 2020 ACADEMIC ACCOMMODATIONS **CLARK KENT**

- Extended time (1.5x) for timed assessments (exams, tests, and quizzes)
- Testing in a distraction-reduced environment
- Maximum of one final exam per day
- Notes from a peer note-taker (contingent on there being a volunteer) or use of assistive technology, such as a Smart Pen, to record class in adherence with ADS documented standards. If using this accommodation, the means of implementation should be selected from the list provided on the Access Plan. (If the class will be recorded, PA law requires faculty to convey: "This class may be recorded for accommodation purposes.")
- Use of computer for note-taking and to capture the sound recording of class lectures (Note: if the student will record class, PA law requires all present to be notified.)
