

On October 19, 2018 Pennsylvania Governor Tom Wolf signed into law the Timothy J. Piazza Antihazing Law, named for the Pennsylvania State University student who lost his life in a fraternity hazing incident in early 2017. The new law amends Pennsylvania’s existing Antihazing Law, including requiring additional reporting by colleges and universities.

Colleges and universities are required to make a report of hazing violations and must publish this information on the publicly accessible portion of the school’s website. The initial report must be published by January 15, 2019 and going forward institutions will be required to update this report twice a year, on January 1 and August 1 of each year.

The chart below lists incidents of hazing which reported to the college between and adjudicated through the Student Conduct process where the parties involved have been found responsible for Hazing. This date covers the period of 2018-2018.

Hazing, Alcohol Violations

Violating hazing provision by having a culture of excessive drinking where team members felt specific and strong pressure to drink alcohol to be accepted by teammates and to avoid interaction with DPS or others in the event of excessive alcohol consumption; Providing and distributing alcohol to underage team members and to minors under the age of 18 (recruits); Other violations of the drug and alcohol policy including underage consumption, drinking games, alcohol paraphernalia, hosting underage guests, hosting/attending unregistered events, hosting events at multiple locations, and other dangerous conduct

Adjudicated through Student Conduct - Organization accepted responsibility for Alcohol violations and Drug and Alcohol Policy violations including drinking Games, alcohol paraphernalia, hosting underage guests, hosting/attending an unregistered event, large volume containers, and hosting events at multiple locations

Found responsible for Hazing violation and other dangerous conduct

Found not responsible for Public Intoxication violation of Drug and Alcohol Policy

Stayed suspension for the teams as an entity for the 2016-2017 academic year. Probation for the teams for the 2017-2018 academic year

Required impact meeting for the teams and coaching staff with designated college administrators

Restrictions on participation at designated competitions during the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 academic years

Social restrictions for the teams - Socializing beyond regular team practice limited to pre-approved activities related to team bonding with no alcohol allowed for 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 academic years

Restrictions on overnight recruiting visits for the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 academic years

Required educational programming on hazing, alcohol, and bystander intervention

Team captains required to work with faculty/staff mentors
